Klyzewski, the museum is also one of the symbols of Skopje's renewal after the 1963 earthquake.

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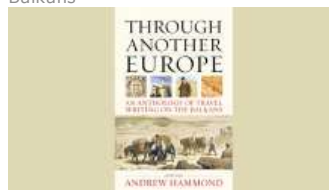


Put on a mask and say a dirty joke in Strumica, Macedonia
